Summer Workshop UPV+UPC "INHABITING THE HISTORIC CENTER. THE CASE OF TEULADA"



WHEN?

From June 30 to July 6, 2019

WHY?

The historic centers of many of our villages and towns are going through a slow but constant process of depopulation. A lot of their buildings are currently not occupied by the homeowner families, whose younger members prefer other neighborhoods. Likewise, their public spaces are often empty and there is no track of the lively activity that was usual decades ago. What has happened? Why these historic centers are not attractive for living anymore? This summer workshop aims to provide responses to these questions by means of the particular case of Teulada, a small town located in the county of Marina Alta, in Alicante, Spain.

WHERE?

At the Higher Technical School of Architecture of the Polytechnic University of Valencia and in the municipality of Teulada Moraira (Marina Alta).

WHO?

20 students and 5 professors from the Polytechnic University of Valencia

20 students and 5 professors from the Polytechnic University of Catalonia

HOW?

Students will be arranged in groups of four people (2 UPV + 2 UPC). They will have to interact with Teulada neighbors in order to know their opinions and to make suggestions and proposals exportable to other similar municipalities. There will be a final presentation of the works at the Auditori Teulada Moraira, which is the place where all group working sessions will be hosted. All activities will be tutored and accompanied by participating docents from both universities.
